Innovation, technologies, quality of life of the elders:
what place of their free choice?

New information and communication technologies and, more recently, the applications of Artificial Intelligence (AI), are playing an increasing role in our societies and, in particular, in the solutions to accompany aging people.

Ideally, they will make it possible to improve the prevention and diagnosis of diseases and frailties, supporting social inclusion, helping in autonomy loss. They can improve also the quality of life for frail people, supporting carers and refine the quality of life at work for professionals.

However, their use and dissemination raise important legal, ethical and political issues: respect for privacy and intimacy, trade-offs between respect and security, use of the tools accessibility, control confidentiality of data...

FIAPA is convinced that the development and uses of new technologies, including artificial intelligence, must be part of a democratic participatory and inclusive process, and in a balance that guarantees civil liberties and individual freedoms. A real dialogue between designers and users is needed.

This is why FIAPA has decided to organise an International Congress in Nice, from 5 to 7 October 2022, on the theme “Innovation, technologies, quality of life of the elders: what place for their free choice”?

FIAPA believes that the participation of people in decisions and actions that affect their rights is essential and encourage the participation of older, activists, citizens and users, in a dialogue with public institutions, the socio-economic and academic world, health and health and care professionals, etc.

During the Congress, we will work together to develop recommendations to ensure the respect of fundamental rights, organising and make effective the participation of beneficiaries in decisions and actions that concern them in particular, as regards the development and use of new technologies in various aspects of daily life: e-health, public spaces, home.
